WALLA WALLA 2020 HISTORIC RESEARCH & PLAQUE SERVICE

If you would like to honor a building by obtaining a research report on its history all the way back to when it was bare ground owned by local Tribes, and by displaying a handsome plaque listing the date it was constructed, along with the names of its owners and builders, you can do so by contacting the Walla Walla 2020 Historic Research & Plaque Service.

For qualifying properties, Walla Walla 2020 will research the complete title and occupant history, and provide a written report, along with proposed plaque language. The research fee for residences is \$100, and for other properties ranges from \$150-\$250 depending on the complexity of the title and occupancy.

Qualifying properties may be in any neighborhood but must be at least 50 years old, and have retained their architectural integrity. For those properties accepted, a photo of the property along with the completed research report will be included in the Walla Walla 2020 Interactive Map of Historic Properties available on the internet at www.ww2020.net under the Architecture & Neighborhoods tab.

Following completion of the report, the property owner may order a plaque for display on the property. The cost of a basic 9"x 6" six-line plaque is \$50, with additional lines and sizes available on request.

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WALLA WALLA 2020 COMMUNITY AWARDS

From its founding in 1988, Walla Walla 2020 began making awards for the restoration or rehabilitation of historic buildings, compatible new construction, outstanding examples of energy and water efficiency, landscaping and, in later years, public art.

Certificates of merit, major awards and a grand prize were given for projects in residential, downtown and general categories. The awards were originally made after the first of each year for projects completed the prior calendar year. In later years they were made in the spring for projects completed since the date of the last awards process.

Many projects were honored over the 15 years the awards were given from 1988-2003, and others were undertaken as a result of the awards process.

In 2015 Walla Walla 2020 is renewing its awards and broadening them to honor individuals and organizations that have made or are making outstanding contributions to Walla Walla's quality of life and sustainability during the decade since the last awards process.

Walla Walla 2020's Goals

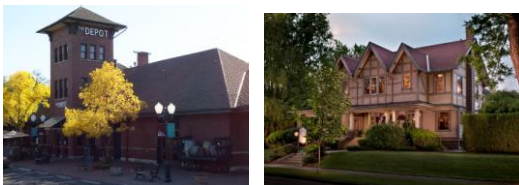
Walla Walla 2020 is a civic group whose purposes are to envision, plan for, and undertake projects to help realize a livable community in the Walla Walla area now and for the future.

Past Grand Prize Winners

The following projects have been awarded the Grand Prize over the years in the Walla Walla 2020 architectural awards process:



1988—The Depot, 416 N. Second, rehabilitation and renovation of 1914 Northern Pacific Railway station.

1989—Pioneer Title Company, 5 E. Main, Jim Nostdal, contractor, restoration and renovation of 1876 building

1990—Green Gables Inn, 922 Bonsella, restoration & renovation of 1905 residence as bed & breakfast

1991—The Liberty Theater, 54 E. Main, William Pancake, contractor, restoration & renovation of historic theater



1992—Downtown Project & Trailhead (now Heritage) Park, Opp & Seibold & Building Dynamics, contractors, addition of trees and streetscape improvements, and creation of downtown park with mural art, landscaping & public facilities

1993—Reynolds-Day Building, 6 E. Main, Building Dynamics, project manager, exterior restoration and interior renovation of 1874 building

1994—Die Brucke Building, 1st & Main, Panco Inc., contractor, exterior restoration & interior renovation of 1890 Book Nook building as retail and residential space

1995—Siegel-Adams Building, 129 W. Main, restoration & renovation of 1889 bank building as law office

1996-97—Green Park School, Clinton & Isaacs, Robert Broyles, architect, Leone & Kibler, contractor, renovation & restoration of 1905 school building with compatible addition



1998—Washington School, renovation, restoration and creative re-use of historic structure for low income housing

1999—Hunter Conservatory, Whitman College, for the renovation and restoration of the historic 1910 music building at Park and Boyer Avenue for use as a media center

2000--Whitehouse-Crawford Building at 3rd and Cherry, for the rescue, restoration, renovation and reuse of the historic 1904 planing mill for use as a gourmet restaurant and winery

2001—Sharpstein School, for the restoration, renovation, and compatible new addition to the historic 1898-1905 school building

2002-03—Marcus Whitman Hotel and Conference Center, for the loving and successful restoration and renovation of the historic 1928 hotel, and the addition of a compatible new conference center in downtown Walla Walla.
